Israel's Music

For their last concert of the season, the Los Angeles Jewish Symphony dedicated their program solely to Israell composers and artists. Jerusalem served as home base or a favorite well-spring of inspiration for each of the five composers, as well as the lovely interpretaive dancer, Or Nily Azulay, the incredible-range singing voice of Maya Haddi, the fescinating oud sounds of Yuvai Ron and the exciting sounds of hand drummer, Jamie Papish. The orchestra, which was founded eight years ago, is dedicated to playing "works of distinction, which explore Jewish culture, heritage and experience," and is under the capable and dedicated baton of Ms. Noteen Green.

Over 700 people filled Westwood's Sinai Temple to embrace the many new sounds and melodies composed by these fresh, talented composers. All the pieces were composed between 1965 and the present. Yuval Ron's lovely closing piece, "Sephardic Songs of Exile" describing the Jews expulsion from Spain and their arrival in Morocco with hope renewed and faith restored was composed just this year and was heard for the first time by this audience

There is no question that Jerusalem is the seat of musical composition and appreciation throughout the entire Middle East. Aside from the Israel Philharmonic, Jerusalem boasts major musical departments at all of their universities in addition to the Jerusalem Symphony Orchestra and the Israel Camarata of Jerusalem.

An array of music by composers Ariel Davydov, Moshe Rasiuk, Yuval Ron, Noam Sheriff and Benjamin Yusupov made up the evering's program. Accompanying several of these pieces was the fabulous flamenco of Cr Nili Azulay whose graceful movements were a joy to behold. She transcended the handicap of a small space with a memorable performance. The melodious and haunting voice of Maya Haddi singing several of the Sephardic songs of Exile will linger in memory for a long time.

And the accomplished and earnest performance by Ms. Grene and the Jewish Symphony created the moods and sounds of Israel in Westwood. We felt the desert winds, we could imagine the sheer beauty of Jerusalem; we felt the pain of the Jews being uprooted once again. And wew shall always wonder and hope that soon Eretz Yisrael will finally find what it deserves - shalom...peace.
